Street Valve Maintenance

The District is performing its annual street valve maintenance program includes that checking valve caps, exercising the valves, and vacuuming out debris from the valve During the boxes. process, District team member have cleaned out dirt. rocks.

The District purchased a Ditch Witch FX20 Vacuum Excavator to perform this maintenance. It will clean out the debris from the valve boxed a lot quicker and more effectively than the methods previously used to the this work. The vacuum excavator is also being used to repair curb stop boxes, and will be used to locate water lines, called "potholing".

The District's Operations Team has nearly completed the maintenance of its 360 street valves.

Water Tanks Repainting

At its April 19, 2018 Regular Meeting, the Board of Directors approved an agreement with Amairitek Services to repaint both of the District's tanks. The water tanks will be repainted within the next few weeks. The total cost of repainting the tanks is \$85,900. \$44,000 of the total cost will be reimbursed by the District's insurance carrier as the result of a hail damage claim.

Amairitek will sandblast the tank roofs, grind the rusted areas, and pressure wash the tanks prior to repainting them. The tanks will be roller painted rather than spray painted to avoid the potential for over-spraying paint onto nearby properties.

The tanks repainting is part of the District's ongoing facilities maintenance that is included in the 2018 Budget.

Water Meter Replacement Project

The District will begin its next phase to replace its water meters with a new metering system. This project began with the installation of new Kamstrup FlowIQ water meters in the homes that have been constructed since 2016. The next



phase will include the replacement of water meters in Paint Brush Hills Filing 4 (Brockton Lane, Danbury Court, Salem Court, Waterbury Drive, Worchester Court, and portions of Liberty Grove Drive and Cranston Drive). Letters will be sent to customers whose meters are scheduled to be replaced.

The new meters will ultimately be networked so that it will take only a few minutes to read the meters from the District's office. It now takes a few days each month to read the water meters and requires the meter readers to walk routes. The new meter reading system will reduce the potential for injuries to the District's employees, particularly dog bites, and reduce labor costs. In addition, the District will receive notifications and alert a customer of potential water leak.

Landscape Irrigation

As the weather warms up, the District's residents will begin to irrigate their landscaping. The District wants to remind you that it has a Water Demand Management Strategy in



place to help it meet the increased water demands that come with landscape irrigation. The District requests that residential and commercial landscape irrigation be limited to three days a week based on your street address as follows:

- **Odd-numbered** street addresses: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday
- **Even-numbered** street addresses: Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday

Additionally, the District's Rules and Regulations states, "Irrigation systems, either manual or automatic, shall only be operated during off-peak energy usage periods (10:00 p.m. through 10:00 a.m.)."

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
