The American Red Cross has some suggestions to prevent your pipes from freezing

Winter, along with its freezing temperatures, will be here before we know it.



There are some steps you can take to prevent the pipes in your home from freezing. Check out the American Red Cross website on Preventing Frozen Pipes Preventing and Thawing Frozen Pipes at

Every Winter, the District receives calls from residents whose neighbors' homes show signs of a water leak due to frozen pipes. If a leak is confirmed by District staff and there is no one home, the water service to the property will be shut off at the curb stop. This will result in a \$25 charge to the property owner for the shut off and an additional \$25 charge to restore water service.

Water Filtration Pilot Project

One of the budget priorities established by the

B oard of Directors is to have a central water filtration system that will improve the taste of the water delivered to District customers. To this end, the Board, working together with the District Engineer, approved doing a granulated activated charcoal water filtration pilot program. The program's objective is to test the

effectiveness of using this type of water filtration system at a specific well. The pilot program allows the District to take a "try it before we buy it" approach to implementing a centralized filtration system.

Board Selects Plan for Office & Shop Facility

Construction Planned for Early 2016

The Board of Directors was recently approved the conceptual drawings for the construction of a combined District Office and shop facility at the corner of Towner & Londonderry. The shop will have five large bays with sufficient workspace for the District's Operations Team and room to store District's equipment that is currently stored on various District properties. The office space will include three offices, work room, and meeting room that can hold up to 40 people. When completed, the new building will replace the house the District leases on Liberty Grove Drive as its District Office. The development of these facilities has been at the forefront of the District's Capital Projects Plan.
